# **Covid Risk Assessment Action Update February 2022**

Updated 11:00 8 February 2022

#### This document

This document records the agreed actions for activities at St Peter & St Paul (SSPP). Changes since the last version are the restart of coffee after 10am services and a return to collecting donations during services. Also full cleaning after major events will no longer take place.

The December version followed the revised guidance which was in operation following the change in guidance issued on 9th December. The assessments documented in the CoE document "COVID\_19\_Parish\_Risk\_Assessment\_Template\_indoors\_v10.1" have been reviewed and are the basis for the actions agreed here.

# Use of the Church building

SPSP will continue to be open for regular Sunday services, for pre-booked weddings and funerals and other events that the PCC agree with. It will additionally be open for private prayer every day from approximately 8:30am to approximately 5:30pm.

Bookings are not currently required for any services.

## **Face coverings**

Face coverings are no longer compulsory but are recommended in busy indoor locations. The wearing of masks is being left to the discretion of members of the congregation but they are asked to be sensitive to their neighbours.

#### **Testing**

Worshippers are recommended to do a test before attending busy services.

Choir members are asked to do a lateral flow test on Thursdays and Sundays

## **Choir and singing**

Choir numbers are no longer limited. Communion will continue to take place in the transept to prevent members of the congregation walking past the choir to the high altar.

#### **Access and ventilation**

North and West doors will be kept open during services.

During periods when the Church is open for private prayer, the North door only will be used for access.

### **Entry recording and hand sanitation**

Track and Trace is no longer required. Users of the Church for events such as weddings and concerts may decide to keep a record of those attending.

Hand sanitation jars are available at all entries.

## **Numbers using the Church**

Detailed seating plans have been prepared as prototypes. Up to 80 people can be accommodated under normal circumstances.

For regular services, parishioners are advised to keep social distancing; this has worked well for several months.

For special events (weddings and funerals) if numbers are expected to be significant, the event organiser will decide what restrictions are imposed on those attending – for example, alternate pews etc.

## **Seating**

All pews have markers at both ends which can either show "Use another pew" or "Use this pew" These are now to be permanently left with alternate pews open and closed. The markers are not to be changed after services.

For Baptisms within services, families will be consulted to see if they are prepared to use adjacent pews at the front which will be reserved, or stick to alternate pews.

For events, organisers decide how to manage the seating.

## **Collections during services**

Sides people will make a collection by visiting the ends of all pews during services.

Use of the Goodbox on entry is to be suggested to reduce queueing after services.

# **Cleaning**

Full cleaning of the Church after significant events will no longer take place.

### **Special events**

#### Coffee after 10am services

Coffee service after services will restart on 23rd January. Distancing and small groups will be encouraged.

# Coffee 'n' Share now takes place in SSPP

This will continue with no limiting of numbers on tables.

#### Morning Coffee in the Oldham Hall for school parents

This is currently suspended until after February half term.
