The local Ukrainian families have been fund raising all year to enable this two-week rehabilitation visit, and they were the ones who asked if we might make these scarves. The young people, who have all lost one parent in the war, are staying at a residential centre in Kent with Doctors and Psychologists who will support them with care and fun activities. It is likely that a Ukrainian Mum will come to tell us more about this and their plans, possibly in the Library on a Friday afternoon when Needles and Hooks meet.
