The past month has been a very sad one for the parish family. The news on the 19th of December of the death of Barbara Dunford at the age of 93 came as a huge shock. Albeit that she was recovering from a bad fall, she seemed to be doing well, and in my last conversation with her, she was still very perky and chatty. I will certainly miss seeing her from the Vicarage windows, as she walks at speed to the shops from Old Town Farm. Barbara was a graduate of the Royal Academy of Music and proved to be an excellent music teacher. She was instrumental in starting the Schools Music Service in Buckinghamshire and was very passionate about her work. We will miss seeing her in her usual pew each Sunday and pray that she is enjoying the glory of music in heaven, with her husband Charles, who was Vicar of our Parish from 1939 to 1976.

It was an even greater shock for me to receive a phone call last Sunday afternoon informing me of the death of our much loved and greatly respected Church Warden, Brenda Harris. Even as I type this, it all seems so surreal that she is no longer with us. Brenda was a brave and determined lady, especially over the last two years with her mobility challenges. She mastered the art of climbing the stairs at Blandings whilst managing to carry washing and various other bits and pieces. She wanted to be independent and succeeded. Her assistance and support to me and the PCC as Church Warden often went beyond the call of duty. It is even more tragic that we have lost her only sixteen weeks and one day after the passing of her husband, David, on the 20th of September last year. And so, they are together again, perhaps sailing the clouds of heaven.

May both these wonderful, strong, and talented ladies, rest in peace, and rise in glory. Amen.
