"War Graves, Local and Worldwide" by Chris Leach of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission and Jill Pateman, one of our trustee/committee members and author of "Great Missenden in World War One", who will talk about the four War Graves in Great Missenden.

This is a very topical talk as May marks the 80th anniversary of the end of World War Two. The CWGC is a global organisation, caring for war graves at 23,000 locations in more than 150 countries and territories where almost 1.7 million individuals are commemorated. The talk will describe how plots and graves are enhanced by the CWGC's horticulture, and will look at the early influences on their design and the challenges now with climate change. The CWGC's architecture, in terms of its cemetery layouts, structures and memorials will also be discussed.
