We don't really know who Bartholomew actually is. He is named in the list of disciples in the Synoptic Gospels. Some scholars identify him as Nathanael, who is introduced to Jesus by Philip in John 1 and meets the risen Christ by the Sea of Galilee in John 21. Nathanael is not willing to follow Jesus without answers to his questions. His assumptions are challenged; he stretches beyond stereotypes. How do we build the same confidence to ask bold questions of our faith, yet also be willing to stretch our minds and imaginations to see the wonder of God?
