The Lord Jesus came to unite earth with heaven and to raise those on earth to the glory of heaven. Jesus explains to Nicodemus, one of the chief leaders of the Jewish nation, that he is the "Son of Man" sent by the Father in heaven to restore our broken relationship with God. Jesus as the one who descended from heaven must be "lifted up" on the cross, like Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so that those who believe in him may have eternal life. The passage culminates in the famous verse John 3.16, emphasising God's great love for the world by sending his Son, and John 3.17, stating the Son was sent to save the world, not to condemn it.
