He has fewer congratulations than Matthew and adds a matching set of woes. There's challenge as well as comfort as we learn to love even those we find it hard to love.

Friends of Great Missenden Parish Church (Regd. Charity No: 1067435).

Sweet Charity in Prestwood has just made a stonework repair grant of £1,150 to the PCC. This is their fourth grant to the Parish Church, bringing the total to £9,650. Please do support the charity shop with purchases and donations and thank them for their kind grants. All proceeds raised in the shop are donated to charities and voluntary organisations in the HP16 area. The previous grants were:

- 2023: £1,500 to repair the 2002 boiler;
- 2021: £2,000 for gutter and downpipe replacements to cope with heavier rainfall; and
- 2016: £5,000 for restoration of the fine 1916 J.J. Binns organ.

The Vine and Branch is a new group, working to keep our beautiful churchyard and surroundings a sanctuary for all to enjoy. Much of this work is a project that Chris Nickless initiated, as he worked to gain a silver A Rocha award for this church and we would very much like to continue this.

There are a variety of tasks, some big, some small: sweeping leaves, pruning, keeping drains clear, caring for wild flower meadows and the Quiet Garden and

Christmas at the Old Tea Warehouse. As you know, we support the Old Tea Warehouse hostel for the homeless in High Wycombe and the residents who are housed in the 'move on' properties. Together, they number approximately 60 and we pledge to give them each a Christmas gift. The presents we give may be the only ones they receive.

This is just a reminder that we will soon be asking you all if you could please consider giving a gift to a homeless person this Christmas. Usually, we suggest that you buy something between the value of £8 and £10 e.g. woollen hat/gloves/scarf, T-shirt, cards, games, puzzle books, biscuits, toiletries (no aftershave or alcohol).

We haven't yet set up arrangements for the collection of these gifts so would be grateful if you didn't yet bring any gifts to church. We will let you know when and where to leave them in the next couple of weeks.
