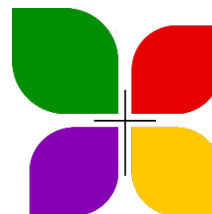

### The Vicar writes...

Paul's conversion is a uniquely public affair, almost as dramatic in the telling as it must have been for the in-person witnesses. We properly mark it as a seminal event for the early Church and for the disciples of Jesus in our own time. If Paul is a divisive figure, so are our attitudes to evangelism. Those reading Matthew's Gospel today will be reminded of the cost of true discipleship, though, as Jesus reassures a wary Peter, the prize of renouncing family and property will be none other than the riches of eternal life.
