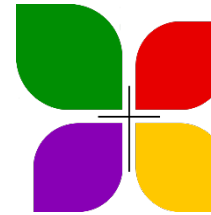

The Vicar writes...

The answer to Jesus' question about two sons is obvious; its straightforward application is that God seeks obedience rather than lip-service. Yet while this is true, Jesus' point is more subtle. What he then says about who can enter God's kingdom – that is, who accepts the new realm Jesus is introducing – points back to his previous words about John the Baptist. By refusing to acknowledge Jesus' teaching as divinely given, despite its clear impact on the lives of his hearers, the authorities closed themselves to Jesus' teaching (which continued on from John's) and therefore from entering God's Kingdom.
